Today, more and more families are being affected by autism and the services of the ADDC benefit many of those Mississippi families. Building on this year's state theme of lighting the way for others, our State Philanthropic project will encourage Kappas to 'Light It Up Blue' for Autism Awareness and donate to a local Autism Center.

National Convention Highlights

The 69th National Kappa Kappa Iota Convention was held from June 24 – July 1, 2018 aboard the Norwegian Cruise ship, The Getaway, leaving from the Port of Miami, Florida. The Mississippi delegation arrived on Saturday and stayed their first night at the Holiday Inn – Miami International Airport in Miami Springs, FL.

Mississippi was represented well by eighteen Mu State Kappa members and guests. The check-in for the hotel and the Convention Registration went smoothly for all involved. Kappas were greeted with a smile and a bag full of "happies" from the Florida hostesses. The Florida Kappas even had a special gift of a stuffed manatee with two children's books for the littlest Kappa guest, 14 month old Harmyn Grace Graddy.

Incoming State President, Joyce Graddy, represented Mississippi in the flag ceremony which was conducted in the Spice H₂O Lounge overlooking the ocean at the rear of the ship. The Getaway pulled away from Miami while the First General Session was conducted and, by the time we adjoined for the evening, land was nowhere in sight. The Keynote Speaker was Rick Miller, the founder of the Kids at Hope organization. He challenged his audience to look beyond 'kids at risk' and see 'kids at hope' by instituting change in their environment so they can achieve success. He was an excellent speaker to kick off the convention.

During the course of the cruise, Kappa members were able to attend three General Sessions and a beautifully conducted Memorial Service. All sessions were planned well and scheduled around shore excursions so that Kappas could enjoy their time in port.
