The MSU program operates a full-service florist on campus which serves as a working laboratory for the pro-

Just to name a few highlights in her career, McDougald has been named Mississippi's floral designer of the year and selected for a nationally prominent floral design team preparing New York's Rockefeller Center for the HBO Network's gala launching "The Sopranos" crime drama series. Lynette is a member of the American Institute of Floral Designers (AIFD), the oldest and largest non-profit organization dedicated to recognizing and promoting the art of floral design. In addition to coordinating floral design displays for many major campus events, McDougald serves as coordinator for the state Future Farmers of America's floriculture competition and participates in the Garden Clubs of Mississippi's summer horticulture seminar.

As local chapter presidents and treasurers are receiving professional development training, a special hands-on mini-workshop "Kappa Art in Bloom" will be provided for all other Kappa members by Lynette McDougald.

# "HIGHLIGHTS OF NATIONAL CONVENTION"





National President Kay Palush

MS Delegates: Anne Cross & Mitzy Johnson-Mills

There were 169 attendees at the National Kappa Kappa lota 73rd Annual Convention in Palm Springs, CA from June 20-23, 2022. Mississippi was represented by Alpha Delta Local Chapter President, Dr. Anne Cross, and your 2022-2023 Mu State President, Dr. Mitzy Johnson-Mills who were among the 121 voting delegates at the "Catch the Wave!" convention. National President Kay Palush presided. During the business session, items reported were as follows:

- **68,731** empathy items had been reported for the 2021-2022 year.
- National Philanthropic Report consisted of \$1,242,876.05 total monies or monetary value donated with
  176,337.15 total hours volunteered. The Kempe Center which is a center for prevention and treatment of Child
  Abuse and Neglect located in Denver, CO was included in the donations. Each local chapter of Mu State is encouraged to support programs that provide shelter and counseling for victims of abuse and neglect. For future
  contributions, checks can be made payable to Kempe center and mailed to National Headquarters.
- Regional Membership Award was given to Delta State/Texas.
- Special recognition with states with Net Gain were Beta State/New Mexico, and Eta State/Louisiana, Psi State/Tennessee along with Alpha State/Kentucky.
- No increase in national dues.
- The National Executive Committee brought forth that the name of Campus Kappa be changed to Collegiate Kappa. During the Business Session, much discussion occurred and it was amended and approved to be "Campus/Collegiate Kappa." The rationale is to continue to recruit the traditional on-campus students and to expand recruitment to non-traditional and distance learning (virtual) students. Therefore, the Mu State Bylaws and Standing Rules will need to be updated in 2022-2023 and local chapters' Bylaws/Standing rules (if applicable).
- Mu State Kappa members Mitzy Johnson-Mills and Anne Cross participated in the Kappa Chorus.
- Mu State Kappa member Mitzy Johnson-Mills served on the National Bylaws Committee.
- At the Annual Banquet, four \$500 Educational Scholarship Grants were awarded to non-Kappa members from OK, TN, and NE & one \$1,000 National Scholarship awarded to a Kappa member, Taylor Lloyd (TN).

Elizabeth serves as the Director of Immanuel House Institute of Higher Learning (a non-profit organization) that she founded in 2007. She went from being a workaholic Retail Executive to helping homeless and previously incarcerated persons. The vision as she shared of this organization is "to take the broken and disenfranchised students and restore a sense of dignity through education, providing them an opportunity for a fruitful life." She thanked Kappa members stating "for each of you as a teacher influence the lives of so many to have fruitful lives."
