## Spring 2025 Executive Committee/Council Meeting (Continued)

During the Spring 2025 Executive Committee/Council Meeting, Mu State Parliamentarian, Mitzy Johnson-Mills, shared the proposed changes that had been made at Fall Workshop and are to be voted upon at the State Convention.

<u>At the 2024 National Convention, the following recommendation was approved "\$10 increase to national dues beginning to be collected July 2025." Therefore, the following recommendations to the Mu State Bylaws and Standing Rules are being proposed to be in alignment with National.</u>

Mu State Bylaws: No changes for no specific dollar amount referenced

#### Mu State Standing Rules:

Page 3: Section Fees and Dues

#### Proposed Revision: The revision is in bold.

- 1. New Member/Active Member
  - A. National dues for a new member shall be **\$60.00** and MU State's dues shall be \$20.00 for the fiscal year in which the person is initiated. Local dues shall be specified by the local chapter.
  - B. National membership dues thereafter shall be **\$60.00**. MU State dues thereafter shall be \$20.00 and local dues shall be specified by the local chapter.
- 2. Life Memberships
  - A. National fees for Honorary and Associate Life Memberships shall be ten (10) times the member dues (**\$600.00**).
  - B. MU State fees shall be waived, and local fees shall be specified by local chapters.
- 3. Campus/Collegiate Kappa

A. National dues for a new Campus/Collegiate Kappa member shall be **\$30.00** with the exception of those initiated after January 1. In that case, one-half (1/2) of the required Campus/Collegiate member national dues **(\$15.00)** shall be paid.

- B. MU State Campus/Collegiate Kappa dues shall be \$5.00
- C. Local dues shall be specified by the local chapter.
- 4. Inactive Member is a member in good standing who is unable to participate because of the member's infirmities or extreme family circumstances.
  - A. National dues for an Inactive member is \$30.00 which is paid by the local chapter.

B. Mu State dues thereafter shall be \$10.00 which is to be paid by the inactive member in order to remain in good standing at the state level annually. (This is to cover the cost of an inactive member in receiving all Kappa Kappa lota publications and communications until the state level states it is no longer feasible.)

5.. Payment of DUES deadline:

National and MU State dues must be received by the State Treasurer no later than May 31<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming new year.

- Mable Caldwell Scholarship (\$1000-\$2000)
- Iva Duggan Scholarship (\$500)
- Jean Terrell Scholarship (\$500-\$2000)
- General Scholarship (\$500)

The above scholarships are established not only to help deserving teachers have additional opportunities for personal and professional growth but to honor persons who have made outstanding contributions to the development and extension of Kappa Kappa Iota.

• Ruth Foster McClain Scholarship... established to help deserving educators pursuing professional growth in a doctoral program. (Admittance to a PhD program is required to be eligible for the Ruth Foster McClain Scholarship.) (\$1000-\$2000)

- Retired Educator Grant...established to help deserving retired educators have additional opportunities for personal and professional growth and to honor members who have made outstanding contributions to the development and extension of Kappa Kappa Iota. (\$200-\$1000)
- Scholarship Funded by Past State Presidents...established to aid in furthering educational goals of an active member of Kappa Kappa Iota. (\$600-\$1800)
- Sara Sunderman Campus Kappa Scholarship...established by the Past State Presidents of Kappa Kappa Iota to help deserving active Campus Kappas to have additional opportunities for furthering their personal and professional growth. (\$1000-\$2000)
- Educational Grant...established to assist non-member educators in pursuit of professional and personal growth. (\$500-\$1000)
